6 SOULS ADDED TO THE LORD'S CHURCH

On the first Sunday of June, Rich Heart Baptist Church celebrated the baptism of six ladies. Three of the ladies live in Ulaanbaatar and attend Rich Heart, the other three live in Choir and attend our mission work there. The mission work in Choir voted to attend services in



Ulaanbaatar to participate in the baptism services. This is over a three and half hour bus ride, with several changes to arrive at our location, and almost everyone that attends in Choir made this trip. Each of these ladies have quite a

story to tell, but we don't have the space to share each of their testimonies. However, there is one that needs to be shared. Pictured above are the six baptized July 6th. From left to right: Oaujinhnam, Tserennadmid, Tsetsepmaa, Udval, Amarjargal, and Oyuntungaa. The young lady on the far right is Oyuntungaa. She first showed up a little over two years ago. She was living on the streets and had just lost her second baby and needed some help. Since money cannot be just given to anyone who asks, she was offered a job cleaning the building. This she did and has been attending on a semi-regular basis ever since, until about eight months ago. At that time she became regular in attendance and also started coming by most everyday. One of the ladies of the church took her under her wing and began mentoring her. This young lady would very seldom ever smile and would mostly walk around without any expression on her face. When she accepted Christ as her Savior her countenance changed, and when she presented herself to the church for baptism she had a beautiful smile that we had not seen before. After being baptized she stood for just a minute with tears running down her face. She still has a very difficult time ahead of her. Life in Mongolia is not easy for unskilled workers. Please keep her and her baby in prayer.

The building remodel is coming to completion and all of you who have ever gone through a building program know it takes a toll on the membership. Services lasted well into the late afternoon.

A year and half ago an invitation was given to Brother Harold Williams to come and visit. This July Brother Harold and his wife Ann finally were able to come. Brother Egi used Brother Harold to teach a series of lessons on the responsibilities of a sending Church to their Missionary, and the responsibilities of a Missionary to the Church. These were very timely lessons to a young church wanting to evangelize an entire country.

When asked by Pastor Egi if he had anything to say, a very excited Erdenbayer explained his desire to learn all that he can so that he can return home and teach it to all in his village. He and his wife will be baptized the 1st Sunday in August. Look for more about this in next months report.

The learning curve of our translators is about complete and the speed of translation should speed up from here.
