Brother Bill and Sister Gwen Jones from Evans, Louisiana visited with us this month. They have been

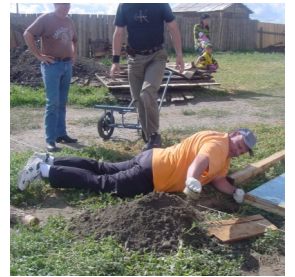


our friends and fellow laborers since the early 90's. We had a wonderful time of fellowship and Bible study. The Lord used them to minister unto us. They joined us in
