**TO BE A TEACHER IN MONGOLIA**

The third Sunday of October saw the Rich Heart Church adding a new teacher to their stable of teachers. To become a teacher for a church in Mongolia is quite the ordeal. Mongolians have a very high regard for teachers and as such, to become one at church, several things must be accomplished. If a member of the church believes that God would have

them as a teacher they first come to the pastor and explain to him their desire. After the pastor's approval the individual is brought before the body and is questioned by them about their desire and their beliefs. Very few are yes or no questions, most require depth of thought. With the approval of the church the candidate is then put into the teaching rotation until he has taught 3 times. The candidate is to attend the Thursday lunch meeting of the teachers. It is here that other teachers critique the lesson of the previous Sunday. No punches are withheld, even on experienced teachers. Then the teacher for the next Sunday delivers an outline of his lesson. Scriptures to be used are discussed and suggestions given. Then after the candidate has gone through this 3 times he is brought before the church once again. This time to either be approved or disapproved as a teacher. Some have tried and not made it this far, but this Sunday Brother Enkjaftal received the approval and praise from his fellow teachers as well as from members of the Church. **USA'S RECESSION HITS MONGOLIA**

As of January next year our regular monthly support is going to be reduced by \$2300. The recession has taken its toll on one of our supporting churches and they are no longer in the position to keep up this support. New Hope MBC of Oroville has generously given a gift of \$10,000 toward the translation work. Our translation team costs \$2600 a month so this will cover the cost for four months of work. We have several churches who have made our translators their project, and we regularly receive \$500 to \$700 a month designated for this task. If you know of anyone who would like to have a part in providing a good Bible translation in the Mongolian language please consider a special offering for this. We are still pushing to have the Gospels completed this year, and the entire New Testament completed with in a year and half. One translator cost \$450 a month, and our Mongolian grammar expert cost is \$400. If you cannot financially give we ask that you join us in prayer for God's will to be done. We are so thankful for all the churches that are involved in providing for the work that is being done here.
