With in a few months they had increased what they were giving him to just exceed his expenses. They have provided chairs for the members in Chore to use and in March they stepped out even further and voted to pay the cost of using a vehicle to drive to Chore and use in bringing people to church there.

CHINGELTEI

Some of you might remember a group in Chingeltei being in our monthly reports until about a year ago. It was at that time they de-

cidied they would try to be a church without scriptural authority. After a year of no spiritual growth the leader of the group came and asked for someone to come and teach them again about what it is to be a New Testament Church. So Bible lessons have begun again in Chingeltei. Chingeltei is a very poor district on the outskirts of Ulaanbaatar. This group of about 10 adults originally broke away from a



n o n - scriptural group some 7 to 8 years ago because they knew the teachings and practices were not in

accordance with God's Word. A couple of the leaders attended and completed our two-year Bible school. The Lord convicted them to want to do things right. Last month we began having a Bible study with them each Sunday afternoon. To this point, they have been faithful to attend. Some need salvation and all need baptism. If they listen and are obedient to the Lord, then He can and will use them to establish a greatly needed church there.

A TREMENDOUS BLESSING

This past month a very generous family in the United States sent the Mission Team an offering designated for the purpose of purchasing two "new" vehicles. Our team goes in many different directions and what a blessed addition these vehicles are. We were able to purchase two Hyundai Vera Cruz SUVs. These are 7 passen-



ger, (or in Mongolia 10 to 12 passenger) 4 wheel drive, with the steering on the left hand side. With the lack of paved roads and

those that are paved very poor, the off road suspension will be a great asset.
