Rich Heart Baptist Institute School Year Ends

In the fall of 2004 Brother Dennis Carrell and the Rich Heart Baptist Church started a Bible Institute to help with the

Christian education of the Mongolian people. The school has offered 8 different courses over a two year period. The first two years Brother Dennis did all the teaching. Not only was he teaching these classes, but also pastored Rich Heart Baptist Church. He worked full time as President of the NGO, the organization that he established in order to remain in the country. As part of his duties in the NGO he taught Abuse classes 2 nights a week, and also traveled once each month to Maint to teach at the Alcohol treatment center. The church earnestly prayed for someone to help him and this year he received some of that much needed help. Brother Egi, who is now the pastor of

RHBC, joined the teaching staff and taught Old Testament Survey. Also Brother Bill Cooper, who joined the Mission Team last August, taught Bible Analysis. This year 25 students were in class. Five students completed 2 years of study, 11 completed 1 year and 9 others participated in many of the classes.

Brother Altenbat had escaped Communist China years ago, and was persecuted in Mongolia as a potential spy. He was heavily involved in political fights until surrendering to the Lord his service.
