

# Mongolian Mission Team



REPORT FOR JULY 2010

## MONGOLIA INVADED!

Pictured on the left is Leon Jasper the leader of the horde that swarmed over Mongolia in July. They came with box after box of torture equipment. Needles to shove into Mongolian men, women and even little children. The masters of torture called themselves dentist and they spent their entire time jerking out the teeth of the young and old alike. In a seven day period they removed over 400 teeth. Two and some times three women in his army would lay hold of each person and squeeze their arms until their blood was under great pressure. This was just the beginning of the Mongolians experience with this horde from around the world.



Actually this was the MacMed Team from 3 different countries. Twenty-six came from the United States, two from Japan, and one from Mexico. They spent 12 days in Mongolia treating as many people as possible. They had three days of travel and seven full days of seeing patients. In those 7 days they treated 2528 people, and gave out over 7100 prescriptions. The two hard working dentist treated 448 people. The dentist were the most popular amongst the Mongolians because they pulled teeth without any pain.

Any trip to Mongolia results in difficulties. Starting with their arrival at the airport. The last 3 people going through customs were stopped and their bags searched. Each member of the team carries one bag full of medical gear and medicine. The custom official would not allow these through and also sent men to pull back others in the group. At that point we left the building. The official kept stating a "penalty" would have to be paid. After some discussions with Pastor Egii a \$200 "penalty" was agreed upon and the medicine was released.

On the 300 mile trip to Oginuur the bus had a tire blow out on the way resulting in an hour and a half delay. The last 20 miles to Oginuur is over very rough dirt roads, and with just 12 miles to go the bus sunk up to the axles in an old lake bed. We had two other vehicles so we ferried the 51 team members by car the rest of the way. By 2:30AM

everyone had made it safe to Oginuur. So an 8 hour trip turned into 18 hours. Time and space do not allow the rest to be told. These people brought a great blessing to all they came in contact with.

## BAPTISMS AT OGINUUR

With the MacMed team visiting services in Oginuur, Missionary Erdenbayer performed the first baptisms most people in Oginuur had ever seen. The previous members were baptized at the Rich Heart Church.



With the river flowing to swiftly for baptism the group boarded the bus and traveled to Oginuur Lake. So in the rain and with a stiff wind blowing, three more people were added to the congregation at Oginuur. There are four more awaiting baptism in Oginuur but Brother Erdenbayer and Brother Egii both agreed they needed to speak more with them about what baptism means before continuing.

## TWO MORE ADDED TO RICH HEART CHURCH

The first Sunday in July Rich Heart baptized two new members. Pictured below, the young lady on the left came with the Mac Med team as a translator and got to work with the Pastor and medical doctor from Japan. By her testimony when she returned this experience increased her faith and knowledge of what a Christian is. The lady pictured in the middle is Brother Erdenbayer's wife's sister.
