



**SISTER SUNDAY SCHOOLS**

We came from a small town in California called Palermo, population 1000. I have been told that during the 1920's Randolph Hearst was going to turn this sleepy little town into a resort for the rich and famous from San Francisco. He made it a sister city with Pal-



ermo, Sicily with a big ceremony and celebration with officials from Sicily present to seal the deal. Unfortunately, for Randolph, the depression stopped all his plans, and Palermo is even smaller today than it was in the 20's. This story has put an idea in our minds that we believe will benefit not only our Sunday Schools but Sunday Schools in America. We are looking for four Sunday Schools in the United States who would like to become a "Sister Sunday School" to one of our churches SS. We have four SS's available to adopt.

Our desire is for a connection to be made between God's children in Mongolia and God's children in America. We will make and send to each SS a DVD of their sister SS. In it we will show their SS classes and what they do. We will have each child introduce themselves and will send a picture with their name, suitable for a bulletin board. We will also show some of the homes, and living conditions of one or more students. The children will also write short notes, that we will translate, and send along with the DVD. Also a map of Mongolia with the location of the church noted. It will also be our goal to update these photos and letters every six months.

We would want the same from America, a DVD, pictures and notes (which we will translate). The materials that are available for SS is almost none existent in Mongolia. We would ask that each church that becomes a sister SS to help provide needed materials for her sister SS. We would provide a list of items that could be used and we hope that your children and

teachers might come up with some ideas of their own. We would ask that this be at least a two year commitment, sending a box every six months. I truly believe that this is a win-win situation for all Sunday Schools involved. We will be limiting this to just four Churches, but we want only those who will sincerely commit to helping and being a part of these Mongolian Sunday Schools. Our Sunday Schools average in attendance from 20 to 35 children. Keep this in mind as you pray about this matter. If you are interested please contact me through email.
